Gymnastics with Kurt Curtin

Gymnastics assists the development of the child's sense of movement, spatial awareness, balance and inner equilibrium. Our play-based Waldorf environment enhances balancing and tumbling skills for children aged 6 to 10.

Children 4 years 9 months to 6 years old will play with simple, natural toys and materials in a homelike environment. They are guided through the morning by the gentle rhythm of circle time, creative play, and snack. They will share the joy of singing, dancing and movement in addition to cooking and crafting.

Each activity addresses the different skills and developmental needs of children in an age appropriate and playful manner.

Raina Curtin is a kindergarten teacher at the Spring Hill Waldorf School in Excelsior, Minnesota. A former Bay Area resident, she was the co-founder of the Half Moon Bay Waldorf Play Group and is an experienced pre-school teacher. Raina is a graduate of the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training.

Children aged 6 to 10 will experience a rich variety of creative activities including painting, fabric arts, cooking and clay modeling.

Douglas Struble is our Enrollment Director and has a BFA in Art Studio from UC Davis. He is currently enrolled in the Rudolf Steiner College Waldorf Teacher training program in San Francisco and has previously taught at a summer art camp at the Napa Charter School.

Lisa Loud is a watercolor artist, class assistant and children's book illustrator. She will be sharing her talents and enthusiasm for the arts with the children in sessions 2 & 3.

This one-week session will focus on exploring the Rancho San Antonio Open Space. Campers will be hiking, tracking and taking field notes while they look for adventure in the great outdoors. Open to children 11 to 13 years old.

Sierra Camp with Pat Senteno

Waldorf mother, artist and nature lover, Pat Senteno offers a nature immersion experience at her family's Bear Valley cabin home located in the Sierra Nevada Mountains. The program can

accommodate up to ten children ages 10 and older. Campers will enjoy mountain hiking, nature walks, fireside circles with a local naturalist, crafts, meal preparation, swimming and cooperative living skills.

The cost of \$500 per child includes transportation to and from Bear Valley, meals, accommodations, fees for the naturalist and materials used in crafts and other projects. Part of the proceeds from this camp will be donated to the Waldorf School of the Peninsula.
